FOARA Vision States - *Healthy, happy, contented and dignified lives for all the poorest of the poor of the nation.* In line with this vision, FOARA has started its operations in the southern State of India, Kerala. FOARA was in search for the poorest of the poor tribal communities, that was identified in remote tribal areas of - Wayanad, Palakkad and Idukki districts where the poor tribal population is more compared to other districts of the state.

Tribals (Adivasis) in Kerala are the indigenous population in Kerala. Majority of the tribal people of Kerala live in the forests and mountains of Western Ghats, bordering the neighboring states of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. The 2001 census of India, shows the scheduled tribe population in Kerala as 3,64,189. Wayanad has the highest number of tribals (1,36,062). Palakkad (39665) and Idukki (50973) districts falls next in tribal population. The Paniyar Tribe are the largest of the 66 major tribes in Kerala State.

The tribals originally are from the Wayanad region. In 1940s during the British rule roads were built and commercial plantations began to sprout, this caused a migration of settlers to this region which tremendously displaced the adivasis of the area. The tribes lost their land where reduced in numbers and currently constitute only 20% of the total population of the district. The native Adivasis are mostly physically distinguishable with darker skin and stout built physique. They live in houses made of thatched roof, mud, bamboo and brick houses set in swampy valleys and plateaus.
